What a YEAR! COVID has been a horrible global pandemic, but at the same time, it has really boosted tennis popularity! The tennis community is seeing this massive growth right across the board with many community clubs and indoor facilities at or above capacity. Additionally the National Bank Open saw their largest numbers this year in both Montreal and Toronto in terms of attendance. It is so wonderful to see the popularity of tennis! As such, our own Milton Tennis Club has seen tremendous growth unlike I have ever seen in my 16 years on the Executive.

You will see in Divya's membership report that we were once again FULL with over a 1000 members! It is not fun turning away people with interest in playing at our club, but for our juniors we kept this membership open to ensure our youngest members of the community still had the opportunities to try and learn our sport. We also referred any adults to our "sister" club at Nassagaweya who also have a lovely tennis community in Campbellville – a short 15 minute drive from MTC.

With these numbers, the Executive worked very hard this year to ensure that all programs were well organized, communicated and run smoothly. I am very proud of this team because as a volunteer club we offered something for everyone!

### Here are a few highlights:

- MTC paid for all fees associated with the five intercounty teams and two lakeshore teams to enable competitive play for the adult players.
- MTC also supported the Junior Team (after at 3 year break due to COVID) by running weekly
  Coach led practices including balls and instruction during the Intercounty Season. This resulted
  in a wonderful year-end victory at the Sobey's Centre as described by our Junior Director.
- MTC also paid for Matt Flood to manage the Adult House league this year which was a nice success for the players not wanted to play intercountry/Lakeshore leagues but still wanted to compete closer to home
- MTCs partnership with ACE Tennis was a very good success story this year with programming run for both juniors and adults. Much better organization and communication this year with Coach Kyrylo more involved in the day-to-day activities supported by Coach Mike Donski and Coach Mihai who have become favourites among our members!
  - Free lessons for new members at the first SOCIAL is always popular and ACE had all 10 of their coaches on hand giving lessons on serve, volleys groundstrokes
  - MTC and ACE gave away over \$500 in prizes to members at this event alone
- Hydrogen run by Coach Mike also financed and supported the Milton OPEN this year with Cash
  prizes of \$3k for this tournament, but as well ran a wonderful junior event with prizes, ice cream
  and fun tennis games for all MTC members for free. This year it included not only singles draws,
  but also doubles. Members really enjoyed watching the high level of tennis. It was so
  entertaining! Big THANK YOU to Coach Mike for a great event!
- MTC under Teo's direction also completed several projects at the club to maintain and keep up
  the clubhouse and deck. Some people forget that this sight is over 15 years old and we are now
  facing quite a bit of maintenance!

Finally my report on MTC hosting U16 Junior Nationals:

It was a success! It was a tonne of work, and my thanks go out to everyone who helped and volunteered their time for this event. It was very special to have one of our own, Andrea Cabio, capture the Girls U16 Doubles Title!

Driving athletes, gift bags, player social, and food were all new tasks at this year's event since last year we were in COVID and following strict protocols.

As you can see, we operated at a loss. I emailed Tennis Canada and was successful in securing an additional \$5k for this year's event, which will be shared with Ace tennis per our contractual agreement.

Lots of lessons learned and takeaways for improvement for next year.

The format has changed and a 2-day qualifying event will be taking place – extending the tournament by 2 days. The dates are Tuesday August 15<sup>th</sup> to Tuesday August 23<sup>rd</sup>. Fortunately, I was able to secure an additional \$10k for the event next year.

This event highlighted the need for further enhancements to our club for our members & the event that I would like to pursue/investigate:

- Ice machine (2023)
- Signs for MTC etiquette, sign in with court monitor etc. (2022)
- New MTC flags old ones are ripped (2022)
- Large Tent to cover the mini tennis court during the summer for campers (2023)
- Flooring in the clubhouse (2023)

Finally, I must say a big THANK YOU to Ann Santos and Abegail Cabio for stepping up and helping the club this year with the staffing and running of the clubhouse. Our VP of many years, Anjali Pagay resigned due to her increased workload at work and home.

The three of us with Matt Flood and Kyrylo Tabunshckyk worked very hard to keep the courts and clubhouse, including toilets clean and functioning. A lot of work is involved in ensuring the club and clubhouse runs smoothly:

- Staffing/timesheets/payroll
- · Communication to the membership
- Court bookings to ensure programs have the right allotments
- Managing membership queries
- · Cleanliness of clubhouse and courts
- Refunds
- Timely payments of guest fees and ball purchases

We also successfully implemented a new POS system called Square, which we piloted this year for debit purchases only on balls. Next year, we will fully roll it out for all purchases including house league, MTC events and tournaments. Financially we feel we can absorb the fees to offset the manual labor that goes into processing the etransfers in Jegy.

The key to managing this has been regular meetings with Coach Kyrylo and Club Manager Matt. Communications between the Executive and head Pro and Club Manager is key to a successful operation.

#### ACE PROGRAMMING

Coach Kyrylo is providing a report on this, but I did want to state that having Ace manage our Junior and Adult programming has been a good success story and we will look to continue this over the next 2 years with a renewal of their contract starting in 2023.

Their ability to staff with strong tennis coaches based on the volumes is invaluable. Coach Kyrylo accommodated every request for programming that we made to him like Junior Intercounty practices and training, and Adult doubles training and the Hitting Partner program!

Coach Kyrylo and ACE also donated hundreds of dollars in prizes to all of our social events and tournaments at no charge. He also supplied all of our club teams with cases of tennis balls AT COST, saving us a money on the rising cost of tennis balls! Additionally, his presence at the club to help with any hiccups was extremely helpful. He spent hours on his day off helping to erect the fence after it blew over in May so that courts were playable and safe.

His family was also very active at our club participating on the teams and tournaments.

Most of all, the passion for growing the game of tennis was most evident with all the tournaments he helped to schedule and run for the OTA and MTC membership. I really appreciate that Coach Kyrylo strives to bring a very positive energy to the club!

### Milton Tennis Club Notes on the Unaudited Financial Statements As at September 30, 2022

### 1. THE CLUB

The club was incorporated without share capital, under the laws of Ontario in August 1981 and comprises its members. It is run as a not-for-profit organization by volunteers.

The club leases its property from the Town of Milton and incurs its own expenses which are funded by membership fees, proceeds from various programs and tournaments. Any residual income which remains at the end of the year is put aside for extraordinary expense necessary to maintain and upkeep its facility.

### 2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### A) Cash Method

The Club has used the Cash method of reporting since inception, with the exception of the 1985 fiscal year, when the Accrual Method of reporting was used.

### B) Year End

In 2006 the Club constitutionally changed its fiscal year-end to December 31<sup>st</sup> from September 30<sup>th</sup>. This brought the fiscal year-end to coincide with the calendar year but not the Club's operational period. Therefore, the Club presents the final 2021 Financial Statements at the AGM. However, the values shown below are as at the interim period of September 30, 2022– see attachments.

#### 3. TAX FILING

The Club is tax-exempted but required to file a Federal T2 income tax return. The Province of Ontario does not require a corporation tax return. There are no liabilities in either case. Tax filing requirement has been met and is up-to-date.

### Adult Programs Report - For 2022 AGM

### Singles ladder:

There were 84 active participants this season including several new members to the club. 287 matches were completed well surpassing the total from last season. ### Challenges

Below here are some challenges encountered during membership processing
